November puts us in the middle of our Hawaiian autumn. The weather is getting wetter and the days are getting shorter, so we need to start cutting back on the watering of our orchids. Hono Hono dendrobiums will soon stop growing, so we will stop fertilizing and cut back on the watering. Phalaenopsis will begin spiking for their late winter to spring flowering, so we can still fertilize them. For me it is still cattleya season and there are tons of blooms. I guess my summer watering and fertilizing is paying off.

We were a little disappointed with our third place finish at the Honolulu Orchid Show. An excellent expression of the show theme is not enough to overcome a lack of blooming orchids. If we do not have enough flowers for the shows, the answer is Auction Night!!! Windward Orchid Society Auction Night Guidelines

Please do not enter the auction and baked goods areas until they are officially opened at 7:30 p.m.

You will have approximately 30 minutes to review the plants and place your bids.

You may pay by major credit card, cash, or personal check.

The bidding process:

- Using only the #2 pencils provided, clearly print your first name, the initial letter of your last name, and your bid amount on the slip of paper.*
- Bid in \$1.00 increments only.
- Fold the paper in half to hide your bid and carefully place it <u>underneath</u> the plant. Do not tuck it on the plant or in the pot.
- Do not look at other bids.
- Bids less than a table's <u>posted starting bid</u> will not be considered.

When the auction closes, WOS members will reveal the winning bids and you will be asked to retrieve the plants you won. Keep your winning bids with the plants and proceed to the payment tables

* The reason for only using the #2 pencil to write down your bid, is because writings in inks will smear if the plant happens to be damp from watering.

WOS board members may use its discretion in handing out prizes. For example, if a name is illegible or if no one claims the prize, another ticket can be drawn.


Christmas Party Grab Bag Exchange Game
