Orchid Tip of the Month by Scot Mitamura

Summer arrives officially on June 20, but it seems like it is already here. We started out with a very wet start of the year, and then the weather seems to have skipped spring and we are now in Summer. In fact, as I write this, we are experiencing the Lahaina Noon, where the sun is directly overhead. I mention this because it affects our orchids and the culture we provide them. I have really upped my watering, especially my hanging/mounted orchids, and tropicals, are in need of water daily. The lack of adequate water can really inhibit the orchid's growth. Let's not be the cause of it! When the orchids are growing really fast, this tells us we need to feed them more too. I mostly feed my collection with a timed-release fertilizer, but now is the time to combine it with some foliar (water soluble) fertilizers. So, let's take advantage of our great sunny weather and maximize our summer growths. I'm noticing too, a lot of active growths and roots, so I have been busy re-potting anything that is climbing out of their pots and of course fixing the ones that are struggling. It makes me happy seeing my orchids putting out large growths, because I know it equates to great flowering later. Speaking of later, as COVID restrictions are being lifted, the schools will be reopening soon. This means that we will be able to have shows again. This is why we need to get our orchids in top shape this summer, for when shows begin again, maybe as soon as this fall!

If you haven't re-potted your Hono Honos, it is still not too late. They should be putting out new growths and roots by now. Re-pot your old plants into fresh media and pot up one year old keikis. These keikis, if re-potted now will probably bloom next season. Remember they like lots of water and fertilizer, they like it so much, it's hard to over water your Hono Hono in the summer.

Summer is a busy time for orchid growers and is not the time to be a "couch potato"! If it is too hot during the day, work on them in the evening. For me, I do my best work at night!


