Guest Speaker: Doug DeMoss "Vanilla Culture and Pollinating"

Did you know that the vanilla plant is an orchid?? Did you know that you have to hand pollinate the flower if you want a vanilla bean?? This month's speaker, Doug DeMoss, is a return speaker from last year. He will be teaching us how to pollinate the vanilla orchid in order to get the vanilla bean and he'll also be bringing vanilla plants for the membership to pot. Doug is the owner of Douglas DeMoss Nursery and a certified aborist and horticultural consultant. He specializes in Cattleyas, Angrecums and Paphiopedilums and has hybridized many plants, such as C. Russell DeMoss, Paph. Catherine Brios, Paph, St. Swithin, Paph. Susan Booth and the popular Mltdm. Pupukea Sunset. In addition to his love of orchids, Doug also enjoys fiber glassing surfboards and surfing. So if you ever wondered why those vanilla beans cost so much, this is a meeting you won't want to miss!!

Orchid Workshop

Last month's workshop was led by Walter Hiraishi and he spoke about vanda culture. Walter has been growing orchids since the 1970's and has received many honors for his orchid plants. The members who attended the workshop were given vanda plants from Walter. Some of the plants that Walter gave away were the Vanda 'Diana', Hawaiiara 'Red Velvet' v. Walby and Rhynchovanda (Rhv) Herbert Kurihara 'Pink', a plant that Walter cloned many years ago. Wilbur Chang also gave the members a Vanda Patricia Low plant. Everyone enjoyed a healthy potluck lunch - salads and sushi. After lunch, Lorenzo Ordinado taught the members how to pot orchid plants. Dorothy had an overgrown Eria spicata plant (nicknamed Lily of the Valley) that everyone split up and potted. The lucky members who attended the workshop were: David Watson, Loretta Tom, Lois House, Hazel Basuel, Tommy and Grace Nishigaya, Hilda Takamatsu and Rae and Lorenzo Ordinado. Everyone remembers which is the back and the front of your plant?? Lorenzo will test you later...

In addition to his presentation on vandas, Walter also gave an informative talk about general orchid culture. Here are some of his suggestions and growing tips:

What to Look For In a Quality Plant

- Fast growing, consistent in growth
- Able to withstand adverse weather conditions
- Resistance to diseases
- Flower rather quickly
- Well shaped flowers, good spike, good branching, good height
- Variable or non-seasonal bloom habit
- Flowers more than once a year, flowers last long
- Flowers should be of outstanding coloration in color intensity

Suggestions For Purchasing a Typical Orchid Plant

- Purchase plants that will thrive under conditions you can provide
- Buy the best orchid you can afford (healthy, robust, easy to grow)
- Plant should be securely rooted in firm media
- Isolate newly purchased plants for at least two (2) weeks
- At home, maintain a "spotless" growing area
- Provide good ventilation (tradewinds)
- Don't cluster plants spread them out
- Water your plants so that they dry out by evening
- Once you gain confidence in growing (not too fussy plants) you may want to try more demanding plants

Growing Healthy Orchid Plants

- Successful orchid culture means to pay close attention to your plants
- Check growth to see whether or not they are thriving
- If your orchid plants are not thriving, you need to recognize the warning signals and any deficiencies
- Consider the following: Temperature and Humidity; Light and Air; Water; Fertilizer and Chemicals
