" Landscaping and Orchids " Guest Speaker: Randy Tajima

Although he doesn't specialize in a certain genus of orchids, he has hybridized the Dtps. Purple Gem and the Phal. equestris 'aurea'. Randy is a park keeper at the City and County of Honolulu's Foster Botanical Garden so you know he'll have lots of information on how we can incorporate our orchid plants into our landscape and be the envy of our neighbors!

Powers and Duties of WOS Officers

With the elections of new officers and three new trustees right around the corner, the board would like you to know what the powers and duties of each WOS officer and trustee is so that you may decide if you would like to run for an office.

President: Presides at all meetings of the Society and board, enforces the by-laws, has general supervision over all affairs of the corporation, make an annual report on the same corporation at the annual banquet. With the recording secretary, the President signs all authorized written contracts and obligations, excepting corporate checks.

Vice-President: Automatically assumes the duties of the president if the president is absent, disabled, resigns or a vacancy occurs in that office for any other reason and if needed, the vice-president may assist the other officers in their duties when requested.

Recording Secretary: Keeps true records of all meeting of the Society and of the board, general charge of the records, documents and library of the corporation and also custodian of the seat of the corporation, and the committee reports and miscellaneous supplies and equipment of the corporation.

Corresponding Secretary: Maintain records of all the members of the Society, including their last known residential or mailing address and shall promptly notify the treasurer of any changes in the membership records, write and keep copies of the correspondence of the corporation and send notices for membership meetings, assist the recording secretary and performs the duties of the recording secretary in the recording secretary's absence.

Treasurer: Receives all monies belonging to the corporation, disburses them at the direction of the membership, the board, or any committee empowered by the board, keeps full and accurate financial accounts in books and records, submits a financial report at the annual banquet and provides reports relating to the finances of the corporation whenever asked by the board.

All officers and trustees should attend all general membership and board meetings. The board meetings are held on the 2nd Wednesday of each month at the Flamingo Restaurant in the Kaneohe Windward City Shopping Center at 7:30 pm.

The purpose of these awards are to recognize two outstanding members of the Society who has made significant contributions in time, service, participation, and performance to the Society.






Encyclia alata
