Randy Tajima's General Phalaenopsis Culture

For those members that attended last month's meeting and was fortunate to acquire a phalaenopsis plant from Randy - the name of the plant is **Phal. Bedford Laurent x Dtps. Dung Nguyen**. Please write the name of the plant on the tag so when it blooms during one of our Windward shows, you can put the plant in our display - just like Randy said!

Here are some general phalaenopsis culture tips from Randy:

Lighting: 65% to 80% shade cloth (800 to 1500 foot-candles). This translates to one-half to two-thirds cattleya or dendrobium light. Your hand should cast an indistinct shadow on the leaves when held one foot above the plants at noon on a sunny day.

Humidity: 50% to 100% relative humidity. No controls are needed in Hawaii.

Air Movement: Constant gentle breeze. Good air movement is essential for healthy growth.

Watering: Water thoroughly when the top inch of the media is dry; but the middle of the media is still moist. Do not allow the media to dry out completely. Phals have very little water reserves and this practice greatly stresses the plant.

Potting Media: New Zealand sphagnum moss (available at Wally's Garden Center, Star Markets and Koolau Farmers), bark and bark mixes, hapuu, peat mixes (Pro-Mix), charcoal, cinders and any combination of the above. The media must hold some moisture and have good aeration.

Pots: Plastic or clay. Make sure the drainage holes are clear. Additional drainage holes may be melted into plastic pots by using a soldering iron.

Pests: Mealy bugs, scales, borers, mites, slugs, snails, fungus and bacteria are common pests in Hawaii. I use a prophylactic program. The means that I spray on a regular basis to prevent diseases from entering the plant instead of waiting fir the problem to appear and then treating the problem.

Repotting: Every year I repot unless the media is still good and the plant has not outgrown the pot. If the plant looks weak, pull the plant out of the pot and examine the roots. If the roots are plump and firm, the plant and the existing root



ball can be replaced in the pot. If not, trim the roots until only healthy roots remain and repot using new media and a sterile pot. To repot, hold the plant at the level where the base of the bottom leaf is about one inch below the rim of the pot. With the other hand, fill the spaces around the roots until the base of the bottom leaf is reached. Place the plant in a shady spot and mist the plant daily for two to three weeks, after which normal watering can be resumed. Watering heavily right after repotting may lead to root rot. Plants may be repotted at any time, but late spring is preferred to ensure good flowering the following spring.

Entrée: Kalua Pig, Chicken Long Rice and Lau Lau


Starches: Steamed White Rice, Poi and Hawaiian Sweet Bread Rolls and Butter
