Glossary of Orchid Terms

Alba: White form of a flower.

Backbulb: An old, often leafless, sympodial pseudobulb that is still alive and can be used for propagating a new plant. Clone: All the various vegetative manifestations (divisions, meristem propagations, and so forth) of a single orchid plant grown originally from a single seed; A clone is often called a cultivar or variety and is designated by single quotes around its name. This differentiates one clone from another sibling out of a population of hybrid seedlings.

Division: Making new plants from old by cutting the rhizome of a sympodial orchid into pieces containing pseudobulbs and rhizome or by cutting off the top half of a stem of a vinelike orchid.

Genus: A group of orchids that are classified together because of similar traits and an assumed common ancestry; there are some 860 naturally occurring orchid genera and an additional 550 manmade intergeneric ones.

Intergeneric: Between two or more genera, usually referring to the hybridization that occurs therein.

Keiki: A plantlet that develops from an orchid's flower inflorescence or cane.

Pseudobulb: The thickened stem of a sympodial orchid arising from a rhizome that has so evolved for water storage. Spike: Term often loosely used to refer to all flower inflorescences, but technically an unbranched flower stem with short-stalked or stalkless flowers.
