Tips for Growing Orchids on the Windward Sitde

Watering/Media

How often you water is directly related to what you use as media. I use New Zealand Pine bark (pinus radiata) almost exclusively because it lasts longer than everything else I have used in the past. Since many of the orchids I grow have different requirements as far as moisture is concerned I adjust my media by using different size bark and perlite and grow something that likes to retain more moisture right next to something that likes to dry out quickly without having to water more or less. For example I use 3 parts #5 bark with 1 part #3 perlite for my Phrags next to my Cattleyas which are in 2 parts #7 bark with 1 part #4 perlite. The larger bark combined with larger perlite dries out faster than the mix with smaller bark with less perlite with the same watering schedule. I don't use any peat moss in my media because I find that it retains too much moisture for my liking. In winter or other times when we have too much rain roots rot because of water logging, which is when your roots stay wet too long without any air. Screening your media and perlite to eliminate small particles can also benefit root growth by allowing more air in the pot that would otherwise fill in the small spaces that would be clogged up by those some particles. By using a lighter, more porous media you can always water more when it is hotter or dryer, but you can't unwater when it is too wet and your media isn't drying out enough.

Fertilizer

Weekly weakly is what I have been told and it seems to work well. ½ to ½ teaspoon per gallon once a week with a good Michigan state type fertilizer year round will keep your plants happy and healthy. I would also recommend flushing out the media with water at least once in between fertilizing. Flushing out the media will remove excess salts which can damage roots and cause your bark to break down faster. I also use a top dressing of dolomite on everything as well. Dolomite is a good source of calcium and magnesium and will also keep your Ph levels at a point where your plants can take full advantage of the fertilizer you are applying.
