" Phalaenopsis Orchid Culture " Guest Speaker: Randy Tajima

Randy became interested in orchids about 25 years ago. He credits his grandparents, Scot Mitamura, Martha Motooka and the Ajifu family for inspiring him to grow orchids and later as he became more involved he met more people that inspired him. People such as the Kodama's, Takase's, Takafuji's, Meir Moses from Dallas, Eric Goo from Phoenix, Mark Rode from North Carolina and Bill Fender from Florida. Randy says he grows a few phalaenopsis and cattleya species then says that maybe it's more than a few, maybe more like 2000 or so. He has hybridized many phalaenopsis plants throughout the years, like Phal. Haruyo Kaminaka, Phal. Chiyono Agawa, Phal. Nobuichi Kaminaka and Phal. Takeo Tajima. He also won the Masatoshi Miyamoto Award from the AOS in 2005 for his Slc. Angel's Fantasy 'Pam' for the most outstanding Cattleya. Randy is an AOS judge, is employed at the City and County of Honolulu's Foster Botanical Garden and owner of Pacific Orchids.

Last month's meeting featured Bob Harris and he's sharing his **Cymbidium culture notes** from the meeting: Temperature

- Warm tolerant can take summer temps to 100° for short periods.
- They do not need the 20° difference between day and night.
- Many will bloom more than once a year, especially ensifolium offspring.
 Light
- Partial shade is best.

- Full sun if in a location with mostly cloud cover.
- · Leaves should look almost lime green, not dark green for best flowering.
- Dark reds and oranges do best with high light.
- Green, white and yellow need reduced light when buds come out of the sheath.

Growing Media

Good drainage is important.

- A layer of styrofoam peanuts helps.
- I use perlite (20%), bark 40%, coco chips 40%. Coco chips plus cinder is ok, bark is ok.
- · Add dolomite.

Watering

- When warmer and drier, water 2-3 times a week, especially when young.
- Winter months can have less watering.
 Do not let roots dry out.
 Be sure to water well between fertilizing.
- Water with high N January to June, Low N June to December.
- Fertilize 2-4 X per month. If more frequent, use less concentration.
- Good example 15-5-15 with Ca Mg.

• Top dress 13-13-13 type 180 January to March.

Pest Control

- Fungi-good ventilation, use copper based for all, remove bad leaves. Not systemic.
- Insects-ultrafine horticultural oil works for most and is non toxic and no resistance.
- Thrips, scale most common insects.

Snails and slugs attack buds.

Up Potting

- Up pot when plant breaks pot or overgrows side.
- Up potting is best between January and June.
- Only slightly larger pot. No more than 2" larger.

Dividina

- Best to divide after flowering between January and June so flower cycle not interrupted.
- Split with tools along central rhizome
- Keep at least 3 pseudobulbs in division.
- Back bulbs can be saved for germination.

continuation of Cymbidium Culture by Bob Harris Back Bulb Culture

- Clean and dry off back bulbs removed. Be careful not to remove any 'eyes'
- Use wetted and drained bark or bark and perlite only. Fill baggie 1/3 full of media
- Place bulbs 2/baggie partially in media. Seal.
 Sprout in 1-12 months. Pot up when shoots appear.
