Ever wonder what the AOS judges do at our monthly meetings??

They stand in the back of the cafeteria and look at the plants on the stage and talk amongst themselves mumbling words like "form", "presentation", "carriage", "parentage" and "color". All the plants on the stage look beautiful, yet they only select a few and start to scrutinize the plant. Then we wonder "Why that plant?" or "Why not my plant?" or "Why is that plant so special?" or "How do the judges decide?" Well, in place of our December meeting (Dec. 7th), there will be a panel of American Orchid Society (AOS) judges on hand to answer questions on judging, how to become a judge, what judges do, and why they do it. In addition, an auction will be held with some choice plants and a slide show presentation of recently awarded plants.

Judging is a service commitment to the orchid community by judging plants at monthly society meetings and at many shows. Judges undergo a minimum of six years of training before becoming accredited. The AOS awards and judges are recognized worldwide for their excellence and provide many societies with speakers and programs. The judges pay for their own expenses and the money raised from the auction will help defray some of the expenses like photography and rent.
