NEW MEMBER EVENT: A Hands on – Repotting Adventure in Aina Haina

This is initially open to new members only – preferably so new that you are not sure what is going on!!! It is limited to the first 10 to sign-up. After that, we will have a “standby” list in the event someone cancels out.

When – Saturday, July 20th, Time – Early-morning – we will set the time as we get closer. A hosted Lunch afterwards at the Greek Marina to recap what we learned.

Where – We will most likely meet in Hawaii Kai at Koko Marina by the theaters, and car-pool to Aina Haina.

What – We will be working with and repotting about 50 or so orchids – all types – and I will talk about Orchids 101 during the repotting. You will have a chance to learn about Orchids A – Z and actually repot some to get the hang of it. Once I show you the ‘tricks’ you will see how easy it really is to care for your orchids!

Orchid Tip of the Month by Scot Mitamura

June brings us into the beginning of summer. It looks like it will be a good, long, hot summer, which is great for growing our orchids. These long days are beneficial for our orchids to grow big and strong, so that they can produce beautiful blooms later in the year. Let's start increasing our watering and fertilizing, the orchids are hungry!

Repotting is the biggest push throughout summer as many of our orchids are in some sort of growth stage.

If you haven't cut your Hono Hono stems, it is still not too late. Cut them into four inch sections and lay them in a pot on top of any type of moist potting medium and watch the keikis emerge. Make sure you label what type of cuttings they are, as some of us have different types that bloom at different times. You surely don't want to mix them up. Resist the urge to pot them individually this year. Let them grow strong and repot them next year around this time and they should bloom the following season. My adult Honos are being repotted too. I like to use sphagnum moss, for its ability to retain moisture and fertilizer.

One problem is the weeds. They are actually my worst pest in my orchid collection. Many of the small artillery plants (this is the common name for several weeds that have tiny seeds that become airborne), need to be pulled before seeding. Whenever you have an orchid with lots of weeds, just repot it. Remove all the media and hose it down to remove all the seeds. You will find that the pot is full of tiny roots. In the media, these roots compete for nutrients, moisture, and airspace. If not dealt with, they will overrun the slow growing orchid. So let's get out there with our tweezers, and keep a very low tolerance for them. Oh, and please collect and dispose of the pulled weeds; if you just thrown them on the ground, they will be a problem there too!
